

Their proposal fee is 6% of the contract total for the project documents and 4% for project administration not to exceed \$12,000 in total. If the bids for the necessary roof repairs are not acceptable, staff would like to reserve the right to refuse any and all bids.





The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) requires the County to have a bi-annual valuation performed on other post-employment benefits (OPEB) provided to our retirees. Much like our annual pension valuations, the OPEB valuation determines the true cost of providing health care and dental benefits to our retirees. These long-term costs are then reported in the County's annual audit.

We have previously employed Cavanaugh Macdonald Consulting of Kennesaw to perform the 2009, 2011, 2013, 2015 and 2017 valuations. Since we are currently in the ACCG pension plan and are affiliated with the ACCG health program (BC/BS), we are able to obtain these services at substantially cheaper prices. Under the Cavanaugh Macdonald pricing chart, we fall into the Group B - 100 or more total active and retired participants at a base fee of \$8,000 plus a per participant fee of \$2.50 in the 500 or more total active and retired participants category. The total cost is \$9,650.

We are requesting authorization to execute the attached Memorandum of Participation with Cavanaugh Macdonald Consulting for actuarial services associated with our OPEB valuation.

At their August 16, 2019 meeting the Board approved the purchase of two new Chevy Tahoe pursuit vehicles for use in the Sheriff's Department Patrol Division from Hardy Chevrolet at a unit cost of \$33,404 each. These vehicles were purchased off the state-wide contract and were scheduled for a November delivery. After the initial order, Chevrolet went on strike and even though the strike ended in October production has not caught up to demand. Six months after our initial order, Hardy Chevrolet still cannot tell us when these vehicles will be manufactured and delivered. For these reasons staff is recommending cancellation of this order and is requesting approval to order two replacement Tahoes from Freedom Chevrolet of Texas at a unit cost of \$33,762. SPLOST funds are available to fund the additional cost. These two vehicles can be delivered immediately to our equipment outfitter Dana Safety Supply.

The Purchasing Department initially ordered Two (2) New 2020 Chevrolet Tahoes at \$33,404 each which are needed for the Houston County Sheriff's Department Patrol Division from Hardy Chevrolet on state contract SWC 40199-409 in August to be delivered in November. Since then, General Motors had a strike, and Hardy Chevrolet is unable to inform Purchasing of when they will be produced or delivered.

Two (2) other 2020 Chevrolet Tahoes have been located for purchase at Freedom Chevrolet out of Texas for immediate delivery to our outfitter. Freedom Chevrolet's quote is \$33,762.00 each.

Staff recommends cancelling the initial order with Hardy Chevrolet and placing a new order with Freedom Chevrolet.

WHEREAS, The 20' Drainage Easement requested to be abandoned by William R. Taylor and June M. Taylor is designated as "20' Easement To Be Abandoned" on a plat of survey dated January 20, 2020, done by Theodore W. Waddle, Jr., G.R.L.S. No. 2139, said plat is attached hereto as Exhibit "B";


