2. Change Order (Elberta Road Phase 1) – Commissioner Talton

Public Works is requesting approval of Change Order #1 on the Elberta Road Phase 1 Improvements Project. After the start of the project, it was discovered that the 72-inch pipe under Elberta Road had structural compromises and needs to be replaced. The contractor, C.W. Matthews Contracting Company of Marietta Georgia, prepared a cost to replace the compromised pipe with a 72-inch reinforced concrete pipe and submitted a change order in the amount of \$191,659.84 with no additional contract time requested. This replacement of the pipe will require Elberta Road to be closed for the work. The City of Warner Robins has approved the closure.

RE: Elberta Road Phase 1 Improvements (CW12-04, Bid No. 22-03)

Contract Change Order No. 1

Please consider this request to approve <u>Change Order No. 1</u> to the above referenced project. During the design phase of the project, a 72-inch corrugated metal pipe under Elberta Road was found to have structurally compromised areas. It was decided by staff and the Warner Robins Engineering Department to repair the pipe with spin-cast concrete in an effort to manage costs. The rehabilitation was performed outside and prior to the SPLOST work.

After the road project began, it was discovered that the integrity of the pipe was continuing to decline and would require replacement. The Contractor, C. W. Matthews, was asked to prepare a cost to replace the pipe with a 72-inch reinforced concrete pipe. The additional work will require an increase in the contract amount of \$191,659.84 and no additional days in the contract time.

To install the pipe, Elberta Road will be closed at the location of the work for three days, and traffic detoured using local city streets. The City of Warner Robins was informed of this requirement and approved the closure.


